Financial: *Michael Walters Young* Michael gave recap of Budget Process - how the Finance Committee does their work preparing the Budget for the coming year:

After a thorough grinding of the numbers, the Finance Committee gives recommendations to the Vestry for Financial Decisions.

It will be March before the Budget is actually set in place.

January Financials:

January Summary:One month into the fiscal year and the parish is where it wants to be -in an incredibly strong financial position.

Revenues:Technically, pledges were severely below where we would have anticipated they be...but that is not really the truth as we had nearly a quarter of a million dollars worth of prepaid pledges received ahead of the start of the year and recognized in January. Taking into account the regular monthly pledges received, the parish has actually raised 30% of all of its expected income for the year -in one month. **Expenses:** Expenses were \$8 (8!) over budget. Within the expense budget, Health Insurance was higher due to funding an employee's HSA account for 6 months, the Rectors Entertainment line had the Vestry and Staff Christmas party, theProperty Maintenance line had costs for the crane that was needed to fix light fixtures at Barnabas and the Sexton line had two reissued for two invoices for 2024. **Overall:** The parish starts the year nearly \$244,000 to the good.

Overall Financing of the Capital Campaign – Maintain Cash on Hand to cover 3-6 months operating expenses

Rusty asked Vestry to increase internal parish gift to the Capital Campaign by \$500,000 (total would then be \$1,500,000).

Discussion – Loan to First Horizon was negotiated 1-1 for debt service (\$250,000)

VOTE – Motion to increase passed unanimously

Michael discussed Cyber Liability – discussion that Church Insurance Corporation Increase coverage from \$250,000 to \$1,000,000

Increase in the bill would be \$700 (\$25,000 to \$25,700)

Larry Whitlock made motion to increase Cyber Liability.

VOTE - Motion to increase passed unanimously.

Grief Support Group at St. Paul's

The pain of grief can often cause you to want to withdraw from others and retreat into your shell. But having the face-to-face support of other people is vital to healing from loss. Even if you're not comfortable talking about your feelings under normal circumstances, it's important to express them when you're grieving. Comfort can also come from just being around others who care about you. The key is not to isolate yourself.

There are 8 people who will continue to help rotate as facilitators with the Grief Group at St. Paul's. We had a good turnout for the first February Grief Group, and we continue to still receive positive feedback. We did not meet for a 2nd time in February due to the weather, however, for March, the Grief Group will meet on the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays of the month, still offering a morning group and an evening group.
